#### **NAPLAN**

Each year NAPLAN tests are conducted across Australia for all children in years 3,5,7,9 and 11. These will be conducted over three days on May 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> and will include tests in reading, writing, maths, spelling and language conventions. We will be preparing our students over the next few weeks for test conditions by conducting some practice tests with grades 3 and 5.

Children from each grade can nominate for JSC by collecting a form from the children on the executive and returning it to school by this Friday April 26<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Cooking Program**

The Kitchen/Garden Program will begin in week 3 on Tuesday May 30<sup>th</sup>. I am planning to run three sessions with each grade each term following the model we had last year with science, cooking and gardening groups.

Ange Jones has once again volunteered to assist me with running the garden sessions. Classroom teachers will run the science sessions and I am looking for volunteers to run the cooking sessions. Nikki Belleville and Jenny Nield have volunteered to run the three sessions of cooking for grade 2 and 3. Christine Unger will run the Prep/ One cooking sessions. I still need someone to volunteer to run the three sessions of cooking for grade 4/5/6. The sessions will be for about 7 students and run from 1.50 - 2.10pm each Tuesday. Let us know if you would like to be involved in this very popular program.

#### **District Cross Country**

There will be a district cross country competition for students in the age 9,10,11 and 12 year age groups on Friday May 10<sup>th</sup>. This will be held at Tarrington this year. Ages 9 and 10 years need to run 2kms and ages 11 and 12 years run 3kms. Participation is voluntary. A number of students have indicated an interest in running long distance this year so I am giving students the chance to compete. Students will need to train to be able to complete the distance. They can train at school each morning before school but will need to bring runners.

#### Division Level Athletics.

Congratulations to all students who represented the district at the Division Athletics yesterday at Warrnambool. Well done, Kyle Smitten who came 2<sup>nd</sup> in the discus, Zebb Nield 3<sup>rd</sup> in long jump, and Cody Ross 3<sup>rd</sup> in discus.

This is a great achievement and we are all very proud of them.

#### My Teaching Role

This year there has been a change in my teaching role. I am now teaching Reading Recovery on a daily basis. I also teach a spelling group in the morning, the garden program on Tuesday afternoons and take a group in the Active After School Program on Friday afternoon. I will also be involved on Thursday with the Artist in Schools Program which will begin on May 6<sup>th</sup>. As a result I am only available during the day between 9.40 and 11am, 12.30 - 1.pm, Thursdays between 9 and 11am, and on Monday and Wednesday afternoons, to meet with parents.

## Artist in Schools Program

We will begin our Artist in Schools Program on May 6<sup>th</sup> with a visit to Warrnambool Art Gallery with our artist Becky Berger. Becky will be working with our grade 4, 5 and 6 students one day a week for the next two terms on a project which we have called The Kitchen Table Art Project. The project is funded by Arts Victoria and gives children the chance to work with an artist over a substantial period of time on a group project.

Our project is closely linked to our Kitchen Garden Program and children will be exploring art through the local environment. They will finally produce a large sensory garden archway which will become the entry to our school vegetable garden. The archway will include art produced by the children during work with the artist. The children will also explore their own social history through food and family recipes during term 3.

There will be 3 elements to the art experience which the children will be engaged in.

Painting and Drawing

Sculpture

Multi-media

At the end of the project we will be celebrating by having a community feast for the whole school community where we will be displaying art works, multi-media creations and the archway. We will continue to keep you informed as the project develops.
