Term 2 Focus - Swap It

In our last newsletter we let our school community know that our focus for the term is Healthy Minds and Healthy Bodies. Grade F/1/2 have started Term 2 with the wheels in full motion. Everyone returned from the holidays ready to learn. For maths we have wrapped up our work on place value and have begun to learn about some addition strategies. Foundation students are learning about the friends of 10 and how each number has a 'friend' to add to 10. Grades 1 and 2 have begun to learn how to use the jump strategy, jumping by tens and ones to solve double digit equations. For reading, Foundation are working hard on stretching their sounds to learn to read 3 letter words. Grades 1 and 2 are working on improving their fluency while reading at their level. We have begun learning about procedural writing - ordering things in steps and describing the process of recipes, instructions and directions. All students put in a huge effort in our cross country - they should be super proud.
